

The QOPI® Certification Program provides a three-year certification recognizing exemplary commitment to safety and quality in oncology patient care. Completing the QOPI Certification Program typically takes practices 6-9 months and involves passing through each milestone as outlined below.

1. Participate in QOPI®

- ASCO's Quality Oncology Practice Initiative® (QOPI®) is an online quality assessment and reporting program. Practices input patient data into QOPI's PHI-secure system, and receive reports based on the quality measures selected. Practices interested in QOPI Certification should choose the "QCP Track" measures during registration.
- To be eligible for Certification, practices must meet a minimum number of unique charts and achieve a 75% or greater Overall Quality Score on their final report. Qualifying scores are valid for up to one year.

2. Submit Application

- Prior to applying, practices are required to participate in a live or pre-recorded QOPI
 Certification Program Webinar which covers the basics of the certification process and takes a
 deep dive into the QOPI Certification Program Standards.
- The QOPI Certification Application is available through the QOPI portal for eligible practices. The Application consists of six steps 1) eligibility, 2) agreements, 3) practice questionnaire, 4) payment, 5) upload of practice policies, and 6) a submission of available dates for an On-Site Survey. Once all the application steps are complete, a practice is considered ready for their On-Site Survey.

3. Participate in an On-Site Survey

- Practices will be notified of their On-Site Surveyor, confirm that there are no conflicts of interest, and receive a date for the Surveyor's visit.
- During the On-Site Survey, the practice's compliance with the Certification Standards will be evaluated based on policy and records review, staff interviews, and observation of practice procedures.
- After the Survey, a Committee Reviewer will assess the Surveyor's observations to determine whether the practice successfully met all Certification Standards.

4. Receive On-Site Survey Report

- Following the On-Site Survey, practices receive their Certification Compliance Report (CCR), documenting their level of compliance with each Standard. If a practice fully meets each Standard, they will be certified. If not, practices will receive requirements in their CCR and must submit a Compliance Action Plan to address them.
- The Compliance Action Plan describes actions the practice will take to fulfill unmet Standards as outlined in the CCR. In some cases, a re-survey may be necessary.
- After the Compliance Action Plan is implemented and documentation is submitted, a Committee Reviewer will assess whether the practice successfully met the requirements.

5. Receive Certification Decision

Once the practice is fully compliant with all Standards, they are awarded QOPI Certification.
 Certified practices will receive a complimentary certification plaque and be celebrated on ASCO's website and other marketing materials.
